PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING LIGHTS OUT HAYS COUNTY MONTHS

- WHEREAS, Lights Out Texas is a statewide initiative that aims to raise awareness of the risk light pollution poses to birds and to ask businesses, residents, and governments to turn off non-essential lights at night from 11 p.m. to 6 a.m. during spring migration from March 1 June 15 and fall migration from August 15 November 30; and
- WHEREAS, Hays County is joining an international Lights Out effort and a collaborative effort across Hays County by proposing and implementing a simple solution to dramatically reduce hazards to migrating birds, allowing them to safely proceed with their journeys during critical migration periods; and
- WHEREAS, more than one billion birds die annually in the United States in collisions with buildings, each year, nearly two billion birds travel through the State of Texas, mostly at night; and
- WHEREAS, light pollution, from our non-shielded rural and urban lights, both residential and commercial, combined with the enormous bird migration, creates a particularly hazardous environment; and
- WHEREAS, birds are important to the Texas economy and our Hays County Birding Trail attracts tourist and local birders who contribute to the economy in Hays County; and
- WHEREAS, turning out non-essential lights also provides additional benefits such as reducing electricity consumption, saving money, and reducing pollution associated with power production; and
- WHEREAS, Hays County citizens care about protecting wildlife and the environment. The Lights Out Program supports other local activities such as Hays County Master Naturalist, the International Dark Sky Community designations, Adult and Jr. Birding Clubs, Hays County Friends Night Sky, and the Wimberley Valley Dark Sky Committee. It will help Hays County quality for grants to support Nature Tourism benefiting our local economy; and
- WHEREAS, birds help control the population of pest insects, are essential to the ecology of our planet, provide ecosystem services, act as benchmarks for environmental health, increase livability, and connect people of all ages and abilities to the natural world.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Hays County Commissioners Court proclaims
 - 1. March through June 15, 2022, and August 15 through November 2022 shall hereafter by known as "Lights Out Hays County" months in the county of, Hays County, Texas
 - 2. Hays County shall work with the collaborative team organized by Hays County Friends of the Night Sky to provide information to the public about the Lights Out Hays County campaign, the impacts of lights on bird migration, and the benefits of reducing light pollution and energy consumption.

JOINT ELECTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN HAYS COUNTY AND SAN MARCOS CISD

This Joint Election Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into on the 14th day of February, 2022, between the **San Marcos Consolidated Independent School District**, (the "SMCISD") **631 Mill Street, San Marcos, TX 78666** and Hays County (the "County"), 712 S. Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012, San Marcos, Texas 78666, collectively referred to as the Parties.

This Agreement is authorized by Chapter 31 of the Texas Election Code, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code and Section 271.002 and 271.003 of the Texas Election Code. The Parties to the Agreement agree as follows:

- Section 1. Scope of Agreement. SMCISD enters into this Agreement for the conduct of the elections to be held from January 2022 through July 2022.
- Section 2. Appointment of Election Officer. SMCISD appoints the Hays County Elections Administrator to serve as the Election Officer (the "Officer") in order to perform and supervise the duties and responsibilities of the Election Officer for any election from January 2022 through July 2022.
- Section 3. Early Voting Polling Locations. To facilitate the administration of elections, and as a convenience to the voters, during the early voting period established by statute, SMCISD agrees to designate the Hays County Election Administrator's Office, 712 South Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012, San Marcos, Texas 78666 as the main early voting polling place for SMCISD. Furthermore, SMCISD agrees to designate temporary branch early polling places in accordance with Section 85.062, Election Code, V.T.C.A. as called out in the latest Election Orders.
- Section 4. Voting by Mail Ballot. SMCISD and County agree that early voting by mail ballot shall be conducted in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Texas Election Code and that 712 South Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012 San Marcos, Texas 78666 is the early voting clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent for SMCISD.
- Section 5. Election Day Polling Locations. Election Day voting shall be held in approved vote centers where appropriate at the dates, times, and locations recommended by the Election Officer and authorized and ordered by the governing body of SMCISD.
- Section 6. Election Day. On Election Day, all forms used in the conduct of the election, including but not limited to the poll list, signature roster, ballot registers, expense accounts, and all oaths and certificates will be used jointly by the two agencies. All forms will be returned to the Hays County Election Administrator who shall keep them in her custody for the period of time prescribed by the Texas Election Code. The County agrees to furnish SMCISD with copies of any election documents upon the SMCISD's request at no charge.

Section 7. Use of Common Ballot. It is agreed by the parties to this Agreement that a common ballot will be used for joint elections. The USB ("USB") containing the voted ballots for an election will be delivered by the Election Judges to the Hays County Election Administrator's office at 712 South Stagecoach Trail, Suite 1012, San Marcos, Texas and the USB'S will remain in the Hays County Election Administrator's custody, except that the County agrees to provide SMCISD with the necessary documentation, if requested, for canvass of an election or in the event the voted ballots are required for a recount or any court proceedings in which SMCISD may be a party. The County agrees to maintain custody of the USB'S containing the voted ballots for the period of time prescribed by the Texas Election Code. All USB'S that are not placed in active voting equipment will remain locked in the Officers' office. USBS will not be replaced without being logged out and checked out by the Officer at any time during an election. An audit shall be conducted to ensure that all USBS are present and accounted for. A spreadsheet shall be completed at the end of Early Voting and Election Day returns that will identify the number of signatures on the Combination Log and the Number of Cancelled booths, for a representation of voter totals. All replaced equipment will remain secured until after tabulation to ensure that all checks and balances have been satisfied.

Section 8. Reporting of Returns. The Officer shall prepare the unofficial and official tabulation of precinct results under Section 66.056(a) of the Texas Election Code. The unofficial tabulation of Early Voting precinct results and Election Day precinct results shall be made available to SMCISD via email as soon as they are prepared and may be released under law, but no earlier than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. The Officer or their designee will use their best efforts to post all reports for public review on the Hays County Elections website at www.co.hays.tx.us/elections as soon as reasonably possible.

Section 9. Cost Sharing. SMCISD agrees to the cost sharing provisions below. This includes Hays County, the school districts of the county, the cities of the county, and the water districts and all other entities contracting for election services. The costs incurred with Early Voting locations and Early Voting Clerks will be shared only by entities utilizing the polling location for their individual election contest.

The formula is as follows:

\$1,000 dollar minimum cost for elections that don't exceed that total. Since programming and supplies would exceed the cost of elections with very small voter registration populations. Equipment Rental Fees allocated separately.

Section 10. Amendments. This Agreement may not be amended or modified except in writing and executed by both SMCISD and the County. Neither party may assign this Agreement without the written consent of the other party. However, the Officer may assign deputies to perform any of the contracted services and may contract with third persons for election services and supplies.

Section 11. Effective Date. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior understandings and agreements between the parties regarding such matters. The term of this Agreement will commence on January 1, 2022 and end on July 31, 2022.

Section 12. Force Majeure. Either of the parties to this Agreement shall be excused from any delays and/or failures in the performance of the terms and conditions of this Contract, to the extent that such delays and/or failures result from causes beyond the delaying/failing party's reasonable control, including but not limited to war (whether declared or not), armed conflict or the serious threat of the same (including but not limited to hostile attack, blockade, military embargo), hostilities, invasion, act of a foreign enemy, extensive military mobilization, civil war, riot, rebellion, revolution, military or usurped power, insurrection, civil commotion or disorder, mob violence, act of civil disobedience, act of terrorism, sabotage or piracy; plague, epidemic, pandemic, outbreaks of infectious disease or any other public health crisis, including quarantine, social distancing, isolation or other behavioral restrictions; act of authority whether lawful or unlawful, compliance with any law or governmental order, rule, regulation or direction, curfew restriction, expropriation, compulsory acquisition, seizure of works, requisition, nationalization; act of God or natural disaster such as but not limited to violent storm, cyclone, typhoon, hurricane, tornado, earthquake, landslide, flood, damage or destruction by lightning, drought; explosion, fire, destruction of machines, equipment and of any kind of installation, prolonged breakdown of transport, telecommunication or electric current; shortage or inability to obtain critical material or supplies to the extent not subject to the reasonable control of the subject party ("force majeure event ") whether foreseeable or unforeseeable by the parties at the time of the execution of this Agreement. Any delaying/failing party shall, with all reasonable diligence, attempt to remedy the cause of delay and/or failure and shall recommence all remaining duties under this Agreement within a reasonable time of such remedy, or, when applicable, on the next available dates under the Texas Election Code.

Section 13. Should any provision in this Agreement be found or deemed to be invalid, this Agreement will be construed as not containing the provision and all other provisions which are otherwise lawful will remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Agreement are declared to be severable. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement are for any reason held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability will not affect any other provision thereof, and this

Agreement will be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

Section 15. Nothing contained in this Agreement will authorize or permit a change in the office with whom or the place at which any document or record relating to the Election(s) is to be filed, or place at which any function of the canvass of the election returns is to be performed, or the officer to serve as custodian of voted ballots or other election records.

Section 16. This Agreement shall take effect immediately upon execution by both parties hereof and shall inure to the benefit and be binding upon the administrators, successors and assigns of the Parties hereto.

SUMMARY

Senate Bill 1, Article 3 provides that the general custodian of records must post a licensed peace officer to ensure the security of ballot boxes containing voted ballots throughout the period of tabulation at the Central Counting Station. Due to the increased time mandated and short staff of law enforcement agencies, we have employed the Precinct One Constables Office to fulfill this statutory obligation.

The regular off duty pay for a licensed peace officer is \$70 per hour. We are asking the court to increase the security pay for elections to \$70 per hour for Non-Hays County Security Officers, current Hays County Officers will be paid at current rate of pay plus any accrued overtime; and approve the revised rates for the Primary 2022 election.

Pursuant to Local Government Code Chapter 86, Subchapter B 86.011 (a) The Commissioner's Court shall approve and confirm the appointment of a Deputy Constable.

Sec. 86.011. APPOINTMENT OF DEPUTY CONSTABLE.

- (a) An elected constable who desires to appoint a deputy must apply in writing to the commissioners court of the county and show that it is necessary to appoint a deputy in order to properly handle the business of the constable's office that originates in the constable's precinct. The application must state the name of the proposed deputy. The commissioners court shall approve and confirm the appointment of the deputy only if the commissioners court determines that the constable needs a deputy to handle the business originating in the precinct.
- (b) Each deputy constable must qualify in the manner provided for deputy sheriffs.
- (c) The constable is responsible for the official acts of each deputy of the constable. The constable may require a deputy to post a bond or security. A constable may exercise any remedy against a deputy or the deputy's surety that a person may exercise against the constable or the constable's surety.
- (d) A person commits an offense if the person:
 - (1) serves as a deputy constable and the person has not been appointed as provided by Subsection (a); or
 - (2) is a constable and issues a deputyship without the consent and approval of the commissioners court.
- (e) An offense under Subsection (d) is punishable by a fine of not less than \$50 or more than \$1,000.

MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The following is a narrative overview and analysis of the financial activities of the Hays County Emergency Services District #4 ("the District") for the year ended September 30, 2021. Please read it in conjunction with the District's financial statements, which follow this section.

Financial Highlights

- The District's property tax revenues for the year were \$1,466,419, an increase of \$142,134 over prior year.
- The District's fiscal year sales tax revenue totaled \$636,670, a decrease of \$12,351 from over the prior year.
- The District incurred an increase in net position of \$816,448 for the year.
- Current and other assets amounted to: \$3,356,522 at September 30, 2021, which represented an increase of \$777,269 over the \$2,579,253 balance at September 30, 2020.
- Capital assets increased by \$22,300, due to additions of firefighting equipment, furniture and equipment and construction in progress of \$128,539, offset by depreciation expense of \$106,239.

Overview of the Financial Statements

This annual report consists of three parts—management's discussion and analysis (this section), the basic financial statements, and required supplementary information. The basic financial statements include two kinds of statements that present different views of the District. The financial statements also include notes that explain some of the information in the financial statements and provide more detailed data. The statements are followed by a section of required supplementary information that further explains and supports the information in the financial statements.

Government-Wide Financial Statements

The government-wide financial statements are designed to provide readers with a broad overview of the District's finances in a manner similar to a private sector business reporting on a full accrual basis of accounting.

The Statement of Net Position presents information on all of the District's assets and liabilities, with the difference between the two reported as net position. Increases or decreases in net position may serve as a useful indicator of whether the financial position of the District has improved or deteriorated.

The Statement of Activities presents information showing how the District's net position changed during the most recent fiscal year. All changes in net position are reported as soon as the underlying event giving rise to the change occurs, regardless of the timing of the related cash flows. Thus, revenues and expenses are reported in this statement for some items that will result in cash flows in future fiscal periods (example: property taxes assessed but uncollected as of 31 days after year-end).

Because the District's principal source of revenue is property and sales taxes, the government-wide financial statements are grouped into one function that is supported by taxes (governmental activities).

Fund Financial Statements

A fund is a grouping of related accounts that is used to maintain control and account for resources that have been segregated for specific activities or objectives. The District, like other state and local

governments, uses fund accounting to ensure and demonstrate compliance with finance-related legal or contractual requirements. The District has one fund, the General Fund.

Governmental Funds: The General Fund is used to account for essentially the same functions reported as governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements. However, unlike the government-wide financial statements focus on current fiscal year cash inflows and outflows, as well as balances of resources available for spending at the end of the fiscal year. Such information may be useful in evaluating the District's recent financing requirements.

Because the focus of the governmental funds is narrower than that of the government-wide financial statements, it is useful to compare the information presented for the General Fund with similar information presented for governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements. By doing so, readers may better understand the long-term impact of the District's recent financing decisions. Both the Governmental Funds balance sheet and the Governmental Funds statement of revenues, expenditures, and changes in fund balances provide a reconciliation to facilitate this comparison between Governmental Fund and government-wide financial statements.

Government-Wide Financial Analysis

Net position may serve as a useful indicator of the District's financial position. The District's net position (assets plus deferred outflows less liabilities and deferred inflows) was \$4,072,900 as of September 30, 2021. Capital assets, net of depreciation and related debt, accounted for \$229,069 or 6% of the total net position. The District has \$600,000 in unspent proceeds from debt held in restricted short-term assets, that is restricted for the use of construction that is anticipated to be completed in fiscal 2022. Capital assets reflect the large investments in facilities and equipment that are necessary to provide adequate fire suppression, rescue operations and a First Responder Organization (FRO) supporting local EMS services to the community. \$3,243,831 of net position of is unrestricted and available to meet the District's ongoing obligations to citizens and creditors. Governmental activities account for all of the changes in net position at the government-wide reporting level as the District has no business-type activities. The tables below summarize the financial position of the District at September 30, 2021 and 2020 and the results of operations for the same years ended.

Financial Analysis of the Governmental Fund

The focus of the District's Governmental Fund is to provide information on near-term inflows and outflows and on resource balances available for spending. Such information is useful in assessing the District's financing requirements. In particular, unassigned fund balance serves as a useful measure of the District's net resources available for spending at fiscal year-end.

During the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, the District's only Governmental Fund was the General Fund, and it reported ending fund balance of \$3,886,558, an increase of \$1,389,860 over the year-ended September 30, 2020. The District's ending fund balance was \$3,886,558, of which \$3,179,381 was unencumbered and available for spending at the District's discretion.

General Fund Budgetary Highlights

General Fund revenues were \$398,689, or 23%, over budget, due primarily to \$336,670 more than anticipated sales tax revenues and \$52,210 more than anticipated property tax revenues, as well as \$600,000 in proceeds from debt that was not budgeted. Expenses for the General Fund were \$391,171 less than budget, a variance of (23%). The budget variance resulted primarily from most expenses being less than anticipated; wages and benefits (\$135,808), professional services (\$10,579), uniforms (\$12,755), communications (\$17,106), insurance (\$26,711), training (\$29,300), supplies and equipment (\$16,451), utilities (\$6,858) and capital outlay (\$143,461). Appraisal district and tax collection fees were over budget by \$20,121. The variances in all other line items combined was not significant.

Capital Assets

The District's capital assets at September 30, 2021, net of accumulated depreciation, totaled \$829,069. The current year increase of \$22,300 reflects capital outlay of \$128,539 offset by depreciation expense of \$106,239.

Economic Factors, Future Years' Budgets and Tax Rates

The October 2021 assessed valuation increased by approximately 11% compared to the October 2020 assessment. The tax rate of \$.05 per \$100 of assessed valuation for fiscal year 2021-2022 remained the same.

MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The tax levy for fiscal year 2021-2022 is expected to provide an approximately \$110,000 increase in property tax revenues for the next fiscal year. Additionally, the District collects sales tax revenues. The budget for fiscal 2022 sales taxes is \$420,000, however, monthly collections for the first four months of fiscal year 2021-2022 are approximately \$231,000.

The District considers many factors when approving budgets for the next year's fiscal activities. With increased tax revenues, the District's budget for operating expenses is expected to increase a proportional amount to support increased services.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1: ORGANIZATION

The Wimberley Rural Fire Prevention District #4 (the District) was established on August 22, 1983 for the purpose of providing fire suppression, rescue operations and a First Responder Organization (FRO) supporting local EMS services to the citizens of the District. The District is governed by a five-member Board of Fire Commissioners, which is appointed by the Hays County Commissioners Court.

The Texas Legislature passed a bill effective September 1, 2003 to require all fire prevention districts to change their name. The Wimberley Rural Fire Prevention District #4 changed its name to the Hays County Emergency Services #4. The District is not included in any other governmental reporting entity. Additionally, no other entity meets the requirements to be included in the District's financial statements.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies of the District conform to U.S. generally accepted accounting principles applicable to governments promulgated by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA). The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies.

GOVERNMENT-WIDE AND FUND FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The District is considered a special purpose government under GASB Statement No. 34. This allows the District to present the required fund and government-wide statements in a single schedule. The requirement for fund financial statements to be prepared on the modified accrual basis of accounting is met with the "General Fund" column. An adjustment column includes those entries needed to convert to the full accrual basis government-wide statements. The Statement of Net Position and the Statement of Activities are government-wide financial statements. They report information on all of the District's activities. The District services are supported primarily by property and sales taxes. The Statement of Activities demonstrates how the District used revenue and demonstrates how direct expenses of a given function are offset by program revenues.

MEASUREMENT FOCUS, BASIS OF ACCOUNTING AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT PRESENTATION

The government-wide financial statements are presented using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred, regardless of the timing of related cash flows.

Governmental fund financial statements are reported using the current financial resources measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are considered to be available when they are collectible within the current period or soon enough there after to pay liabilities of the current period. For this purpose, the District considers all revenues available if they are collectible within 31 days after year-end. Expenditures are recognized in the accounting period in which the liability is incurred. Interest and tax revenues associated with the current fiscal year are considered susceptible to accrual and have been recognized as revenues in the current fiscal year. All other revenue is considered measurable and available only when cash is received by the District.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

NET POSITION

Net position represents the difference between assets, deferred outflows, liabilities and deferred inflows. Net position invested in capital assets consists of capital assets, net of accumulated depreciation, reduced by the outstanding balances of any borrowing used for the acquisition, construction or improvements of those assets. Net position is reported as restricted when there are limitations imposed on its use either through the enabling legislation adopted by the District or through external restrictions imposed by creditors, grantors or laws or regulations of other governments. When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the District's policy to use restricted resources first and then unrestricted resources as they are needed.

FUND BALANCES

Fund balance of governmental funds is reported in various categories based on the nature of any limitations requiring the use of resources for specific purposes. The District can establish limitations of the use of resources through either a commitment or an assignment. When both unassigned and committed or assigned funds are available for expenditure, committed or assigned funds are used first.

Nonspendable fund balances are amounts that cannot be spent because they are not in a spendable form or legally or contractually required to be maintained intact. Committed fund balances include amounts that can only be used for specific purposes determined by a formal action of the Board or adoption of an ordinance. Limitations imposed by commitments remain in place until formal Board action is taken to remove the limitation. Amounts in the assigned fund balances are intended to be used by the District for specific purposes but do not meet the criteria to be committed. Assignments are generally temporary and do not require Board action to be taken to remove the assignment.

CAPITAL ASSETS

All capital assets are recorded at historical cost (or estimated historical cost) at the time of acquisition and updated for additions and retirements during the year. Improvements are capitalized. The cost of normal repairs and maintenance that do not add to the value of the asset or materially extend the asset's life are recorded as expenses. Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis. Estimated useful lives are as follows:

DEFERRED OUTFLOWS/INFLOWS OF RESOURCES

The statement of net position and governmental funds balance sheet reports a separate section for deferred outflows of resources representing a consumption of net position that applies to a future period and is not recognized as an outflow of resources in the current period. The District's does not have any deferred outflows. The statement of financial position and governmental funds balance sheet reports a separate section for deferred inflows of resources representing an acquisition of net position that applies to a future period and is not recognized as an inflow of resources or revenue until that time. The District has one item which qualifies for reporting in this category- unavailable property tax revenue. These amounts are deferred and recognized as an inflow of resources in the period the amounts become available.

NOTE 3: DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

At September 30, 2021, the carrying amount of the District's cash deposits was \$6,974 and the bank balance was \$24,045. All of the District's deposits were fully collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution. The Board of Fire Commissioners has authorized the District under a written investment policy to invest funds in compliance with V.A.T.C.S Government Code, Title 10, Chapter 2256 (the Public Funds Investment Act of 1993). Investment vehicles authorized by Chapter 2256 include, but are not limited to, certificates of deposit, obligations backed by the U.S. and state governments, and public fund investment pools. All investments at year end were held in certificates of deposit and money market savings accounts in the amounts of \$93,839 and \$3,700,759, respectively. These investments are short-term, highly liquid deposits that are carried at amortized cost, which approximates fair value. The District was in compliance with the requirements of Chapter 2256 and with its policy during the year.

NOTE 4: PROPERTY TAXES

The District has the authority to levy a tax to a maximum of \$0.05 per \$100 of value. Ad valorem taxes are levied each October 1 on the assessed valuation of all taxable property in the District. The tax rate for the October 1, 2020 levy was \$0.05 per \$100 of value. Taxes are due upon receipt of the bill and are delinquent if not paid before the first day of February in the year following levy. On January 1 of each year, a tax lien attaches to the property to secure the payment of all taxes, penalties and interest ultimately imposed. Taxes are billed and collected by the Hays County Tax Assessor-Collector.

NOTE 5: BUDGET

The District adopts an annual budget for each fiscal year and amends the budget as needed during the year. There were no current year amendments. The District does not use an encumbrance system and appropriations lapse at the end of each fiscal year.

NOTE 5: BUDGET

Certain revenue and expenses were different than budgeted, resulting in a higher than budgeted fund balance. Primarily, property tax and sales tax revenues, as well as proceeds from debt were higher than budgeted, while operations expenditures and capital outlay were less than anticipated.

NOTE 8: RISK MANAGEMENT

The District is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft, damage and destruction of assets, errors and omissions, injuries to employees and natural disasters. The District purchases commercial insurance to cover its general liabilities. There were no significant reductions in coverage in the past fiscal year and no settlements exceeding insurance coverage.

NOTE 9: PENSION PLAN

The District has a defined contribution benefit plan, a Simple IRA, for eligible employees. Eligible employees may make discretionary contributions to the Plan and the District matches contributions up to 3% of eligible compensation. The District's contribution for the fiscal year was \$55,886.

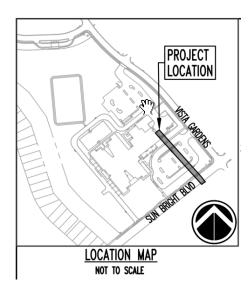

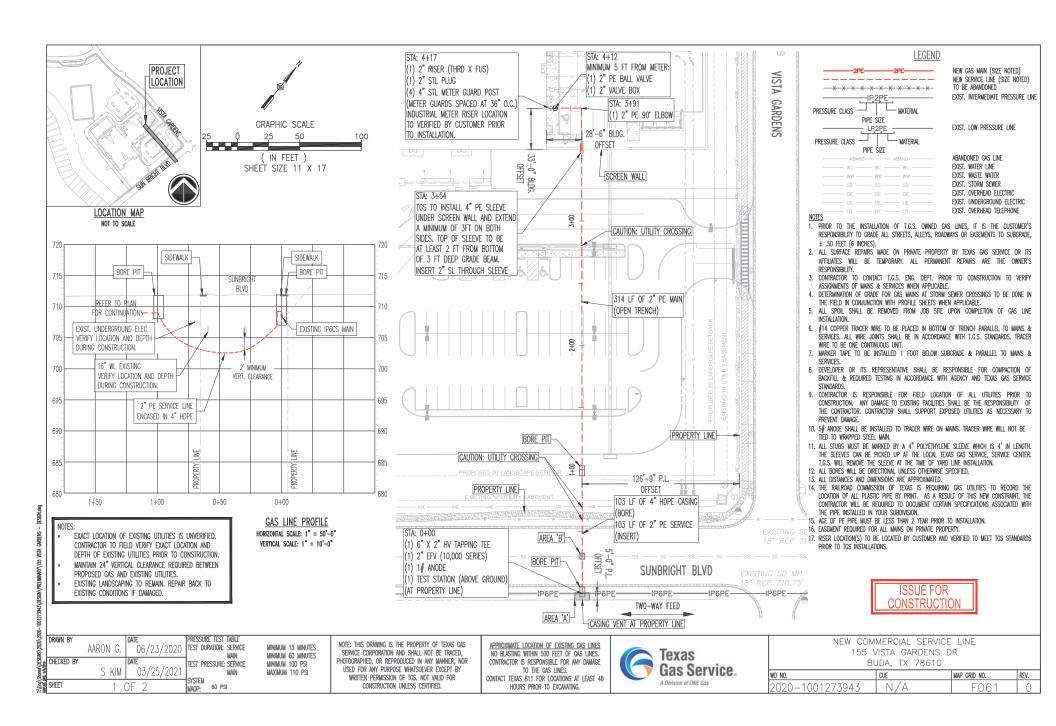

FIRST AMENDED AND RESTATED AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE JOINT FUNDING FOR THE PROVISION OF YOUTH SERVICES

As of <u>February 2</u>, 2021 (the "Effective Date") the City of San Marcos (the "City") and Texas State University (the "University"), San Marcos Consolidated Independent School District (the "SMCISD"), and Hays County enter into this First Amended and Restated Agreement to Provide Joint Funding for the Provision of Youth Services (the "Agreement"), for the creation and joint funding of a youth services director to administer youth services and programs on behalf of and for the mutual benefit of the parties to this Agreement.

I. RECITALS:

- 1.1. Pursuant to that certain Agreement to Provide Joint Funding for the Provision of Youth Services effective as of March 3, 2020 (the "Original Agreement"), the City, the University, SMCISD, and Hays County (hereinafter, the "Core 4" or the "Parties," or individually, a "Party") established a program for youth programming that will include information on the benefits of a post-secondary education and continuing education beyond a high school diploma. The Parties wish to amend the terms of the Original Agreement as set forth in this Agreement below.
- **1.2.** The Core 4 wish to work cooperatively to create educational links between each of them in order to continue the Bobcat Promise and to foster better communications
- **1.3.** The parties will appoint elected and/or executive level representatives to create the Core 4 Policy Group as follows: two members from Hays County, two members from the University, two members from SMCISD, and three members from the City.
- 1.4 The parties will also appoint representatives to a working group known as the Core 4 Task Force (the "Task Force"), The Core 4 Task Force will consist of two representatives appointed by Hays County, the University and SMCISD and three representatives appointed by the City. The Task Force will provide oversight for ongoing collaborative youth services planning for San Marcos area youth, and provide recommendations for policy related items to the Core 4.
- **1.5.** The Core 4 wish to jointly fund the creation of a youth services director (the "Director") that will be responsible for administering and delivering programs for youth in the community and other related services agreed to by the Core 4. The Director will work with the Core 4 Task Force and will provide quarterly reports to the Core 4 Policy Group on the Task Force's activities.
- **1.6.** The Core 4 wish to designate the City as the Party responsible for contracting with Community Action, Inc. to provide the personnel to serve as the Director.
- **1.7.** For the reasons stated above, and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties enter into this agreement.

II. AGREEMENT

2.1. City Agreements. The City agrees to:

- **2.1.1.** Subject to each Party's advance review and written approval, execute a contract with Community Action, Inc. to procure the services of and set the terms of compensation of the Director in an amount not to exceed \$90,000.00 for the wages or salary, and the cost of benefits for the person serving as the Director, plus an amount up to \$20,000.00 for associated administrative and program expenses, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$110,000.00.
- **2.1.2.** Manage the contract with Community Action, Inc. and the day to day activities of the Director, and provide staff support to the Director for implementation of the Youth Master Plan.
- **2.1.3.** Contribute funding toward the compensation to be paid to Community Action, Inc. under said contract for Director services with the City as follows: a) no less than 50 percent of the wages or salary, plus the cost of benefits paid to the person serving as the Director; and b) up to \$5,000.00 for associated administrative and program expenses, contingent on the availability of funding.
- **2.1.4.** Deliver one or more invoices to the each of the Parties for payment of each Party's share (as described in paragraph 2.1.3) of amounts owed by the City under its contract with Community Action, Inc for the services of the Director.
- **2.1.5.** Meet with the Core 4 Policy Group at least once annually,, to: a) establish the scope of work and compensation of Community Action, Inc. for the Director services to be contracted with the City; b) evaluate the performance of Community Action, Inc. under said contract; and c) set common goals, including the promotion of post-secondary educational opportunities, for the upcoming year's work.
- **2.1.6.** Designate a representative authorized to act on the City's behalf in relation to the obligations under this Agreement.
- **2.2. University, SMCISD and Hays County Agreements:** The University, SMCISD, Hays County agree to:
 - **2.2.1.** Each contribute funding toward the compensation to be paid to Community Action, Inc. under said contract for Director services with the City as follows: a) no less than one-third of the remaining 50 percent of the wages or salary, plus the cost of benefits paid to the person serving as the Director; and b) up to \$5,000.00 for associated administrative and program expenses, contingent on the availability of funding.
 - **2.2.2.** Each make such contributions by paying the City directly 15 days after the receipt of one or more invoices from the City for amounts owed by the City under its contract with Community Action, Inc for the services of the Director.

- **2.2.3.** Meet with the Core 4 Policy Group at least once annually, to: a) establish the scope of work and compensation of Community Action, Inc. for the Director services to be contracted with the City; b) evaluate the performance of Community Action, Inc. under said contract; and c) set common goals, including the promotion of post-secondary educational opportunities, for the upcoming year's work.
- **2.2.4.** Each designate a representative authorized to act on their behalf in relation to their respective obligations under this Agreement.

III. TERM

The term of this Agreement will commence on the Effective Date of hire of the Youth Services Director by Community Action, Inc. and will continue for two years unless sooner terminated in accordance with other terms of this Agreement.

For clarification: the term of this agreement expires January 25, 2023 as a Youth Services Director started on January 25, 2021.

IV. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- **4.1. Cooperation.** The Parties agree to cooperate with each other in good faith at all times during the term of this Agreement in order to achieve the purposes and intent of this Agreement. Each Party to this Agreement acknowledges and represents that this Agreement has been executed by its duly authorized representative.
- **4.2. Funding.** The Parties acknowledge that funding under this Agreement will be made from current revenues legally available to each of the Parties.
- **4.3. Entire Agreement.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior understandings and agreements between the Parties regarding such matters. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by written agreement executed by all Parties. No Party may assign this Agreement without the written consent of the other Parties.
- **4.4. Invalid Provisions; Severability.** Should any provision in this Agreement be found or deemed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, this Agreement will be construed as not containing the provision and all other provisions that are otherwise lawful will remain in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Agreement are declared severable.
- **4.5. Applicable Law.** This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Exclusive venue for any dispute arising under this Agreement is in Hays County, Texas.
- **4.6. Public Information Act.** The Parties are governed by the Texas Public Information Act, Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code. This Agreement and all written information generated under this Agreement may be subject to release under the Act.

- **4.7. Termination.** Any Party may terminate this Agreement by giving at least 60 days' advance written notice of termination to the other Parties. In such event, the terminating Party shall remain responsible for payment to the City of its share of funding for any amounts due to Community Action, Inc. under its Youth Services Director contract with the City through the actual date such contract may be and is terminated by the City as a result of the Party's termination under this paragraph. After termination of this Agreement, each Party shall be reimbursed their respective share of any unexpended funds held by the City, if any.
- **4.8. Binding Effect; Assignment.** This Agreement shall take effect immediately upon the Effective Date and shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the administrators, successors and assigns of the Parties. The City, the Parties will not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement.
- **4.9. Limitation on Liability and Immunity.** The Parties each reserve their applicable constitutional, statutory and common law rights, privileges, statutory limitations on liability, immunities and defenses.
- **4.9. Amendments.** This Agreement, including appendices and referenced attachments represents the entire and integrated Agreement between the City, the University, SMCISD, and Hays County and supersedes all prior proposals, negotiations, representations or agreements either written or oral between the parties. This Agreement may be amended only by separate written instrument approved by the Parties.
- **4.10. Notice.** Unless otherwise specified, written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered by email, hand-delivery, or by certified mail to the addresses for each Party as follows:

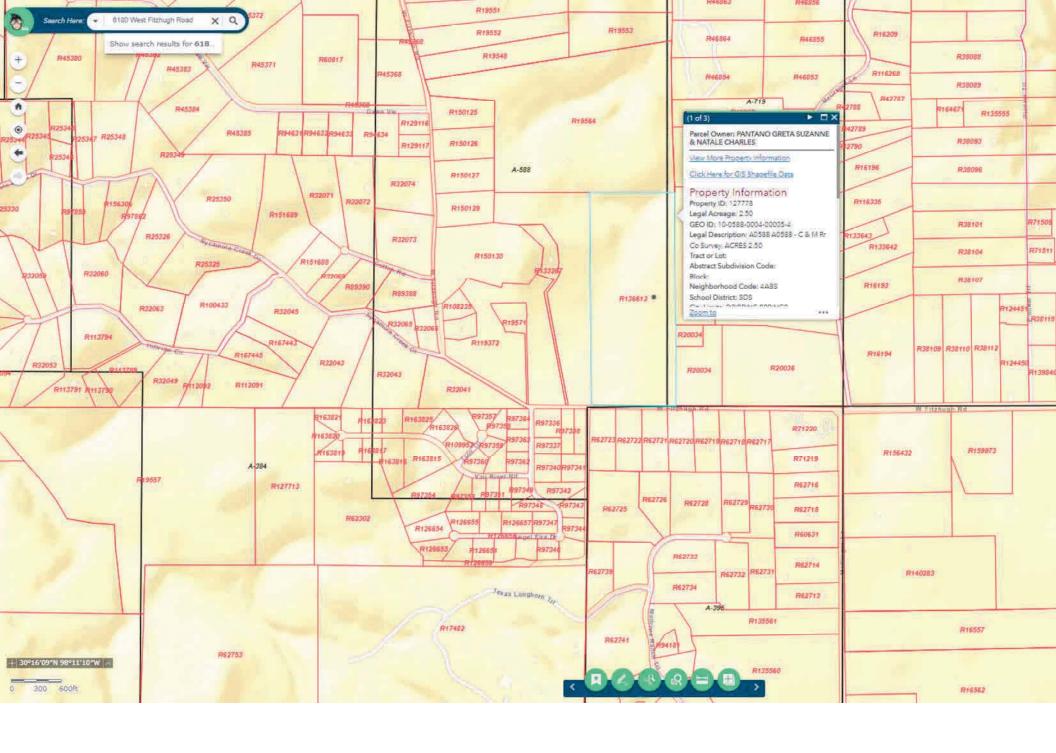

INTERLOCAL PURCHASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN HAYS COUNTY, TEXAS AND THE CITY OF BUDA, TEXAS

This Interlocal Purchase Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into by the Hays County, Texas and the City of Buda, Texas, acting by and through their respective signature authorities, pursuant to and under authority of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code and Chapter 271 of the Texas Local Government Code, for the purpose of participating in cooperative purchasing. The undersigned Local Governments may be referred to in this Agreement individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, this Agreement is authorized by Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code and Subchapter F, Chapter 271 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the Parties are local governments as that term is defined in Section 271.101(2) of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 271.102 of the Texas Local Government Code authorizes local governments to participate in a cooperative purchasing program with another local government or local cooperative organization; and

WHEREAS, a local government that purchases materials, supplies, goods, services or equipment pursuant to a cooperative purchasing program with another local government satisfies therequirement of the local government to seek competitive bids for the purchase of the goods or services; and

WHEREAS, local governments in the State of Texas have the ability to realize substantial savings and economies of scale by cooperatively procuring materials, supplies, goods, services or equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into a cooperative purchasing program which will allow Parties to purchase materials, supplies, goods, services or equipment pursuant to Subchapter F, Chapter 271 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the Parties, acting by and through their respective signature authorities, adopt the foregoing premises as findings of said governing bodies.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, inducements, covenants, agreements, conditions and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE I PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish a cooperative purchasing program between the Partieswhich will allow the Parties to realize savings when purchasing materials, supplies, goods, services or

equipment, and which will facilitate the Parties' ability to satisfy state laws requiring the Parties to seek competitive bids for the purchase of goods and services. Each Party, in contracting for the purchase of supplies, materials, equipment, and services agrees, at its discretion, to extend contracts for shared use to the extent permitted by law and agreed upon by those parties and vendors.

ARTICLE II TERM

The term of this Agreement shall commence on the date on which all Parties have executed this Agreement ("Effective Date"). This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect unless superseded by a supplemental agreement or terminated as provided in this Agreement.

ARTICLE III TERMINATION

A Party may withdraw its participation from this Agreement by providing thirty (30) days prior writtennotice to the other Parties. However, termination of this Agreement by a Party shall not terminate an existing contract between a Party and a vendor.

ARTICLE IV PURCHASING

Each Party shall designate a person to act on their behalf in all matters relating to the cooperative purchasing program. All purchases shall be effected by a purchase order from the purchasing party and directed to the vendor(s). The Parties shall make payments directly to vendors under the contracts made under Chapter 271, Subchapter F, Texas Local Government Code. The purchasing Party shall be responsible for the vendors' compliance with provisions relating to the quality of items and terms of delivery. The originating contracting Party is not responsible or liable for the performance of any vendor used by the purchasing Party as a result of this Agreement.

ARTICLE V CURRENT REVENUE

The Parties warrant that all payments, expenditures, contributions, fees, costs, and disbursements, if any, required of it hereunder or required by any other agreements, contracts and documents executed, adopted, or approved pursuant to this Agreement, which shall include any exhibit, attachment, addendum or associated document, shall be paid from current revenues available to the paying Party. The Parties hereby warrant that no debt is created by this Agreement and that any debt created througha purchase shall be the sole obligation of the purchasing Party and no obligation or liability for such debt shall be a liability or obligation of the other Parties.

ARTICLE VI FISCAL FUNDING

The financial obligations of the Parties, if any, under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability and appropriation of sufficient funding. Any Party may withdraw from this Agreement without penalty in the event funds are not available or appropriated. However, no Party will be entitled to a refund of amounts previously contributed in the event of withdrawal for lack of funding.

ARTICLE VII MISCELLANEOUS

- A. <u>Notice</u>: Any notice required or permitted to be delivered hereunder shall be deemed received whensent in the United States Mail, Postage Prepaid, Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, or by hand-delivery, facsimile transmission, or email transmission addressed to the respective Party at the addresset forth opposite the signature of the Party.
- B. Amendment: This Agreement may be amended by the mutual written agreement of the Parties.
- C. <u>Severability:</u> In the event any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect the other provisions, and the Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this Agreement.
- D. <u>Governing Law:</u> The validity of this Agreement and any of its terms and provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the Parties, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any action concerning this Agreement shall lie in Hays County, Texas.
- E. No Waiver of Immunities: Neither Party waives, modifies, or alters to any extent whatsoever the availability of the defense of governmental immunity under the laws of the State of Texas and the UnitedStates.
- F. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: This Agreement represents the entire agreement among the Parties with respect to the subject matter covered by this Agreement. There is no other collateral, oral or written agreement between the Parties that in any manner relates to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- G. Recitals: The recitals to this Agreement are incorporated herein.
- H. <u>Counterparts:</u> This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original constituting one and the same instrument.
- I. No Assignment: The Parties may not assign or transfer their rights under this Agreement.
- J. <u>Compliance with Law:</u> Each Party is responsible for complying with any additional or varying laws and regulations regarding purchases.
- K. <u>No Waiver of Rights:</u> Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to waive, modify or amend any legal defense available at law or equity to a Party, including the defense of sovereign immunity, nor tocreate any legal rights or claims on behalf of a person not a party to this Agreement.
