THE FOLLOWING PROCEEDINGS WERE HAD, THAT IS:

Pastor Darius Todd gave the invocation. Judge Becerra led the court in the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States and Texas flags. Judge Becerra called the meeting to order.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Rodrigo Amaya made a public comment about lack of accountability. Amy Kamp made a public comment about jail outsourcing. Elaine Cardenas, County Clerk, read aloud an emailed public comment from Jeanette Kinard against the replat of Burnet Ranch, Section 3, Lot 55.

Juli Barksdale, Epidemiologist, spoke on the importance of getting vaccinated. Commissioner Ingalsbe thanked her and the Health Department for their work.

Presentation by Ardurra regarding use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for Friends of the Pound House.

Eric Boehning, Senior Manager for Ardurra, stated this is a grant award for loss of revenue in the amount of \$50,000 to Friends of the Pound House.

Presentation by Ardurra regarding use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for the Maxwell Special Utility District.

Eric Boehning, Senior Manager for Ardurra, stated this is a subrecipient agreement to allow the purchase of a 200 KW Generator by Maxwell Special Utility District. The cost of the generator is \$134,000.00 to be purchased with an award of \$50,000 from Hays County, \$50,000 from Caldwell County and Maxwell SUD covering the difference. Judge Becerra asked about funding more. Commissioner Ingalsbe stated Maxwell SUD has expressed the \$50,000 will be enough.

Presentation by Ardurra regarding use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for Hays County Food Bank.

Eric Boehning, Senior Manager for Ardurra, stated this is another subrecipient agreement for \$1.188 Million. \$88,000 has been earmarked towards a feasibility study and \$1.1 Million for construction and expansion of the Hays County Food Bank. Judge Becerra asked for an explanation on the location. Commissioner Jones stated the plan is to move out to the Village. Jamie Lee Case, President of Hays County Food Bank, stated they will not stop mobile distributions. She stated they currently operate out of a 2,200 square foot capacity, they do not have room for large donations, and they remain at capacity year-round. Eleanor Owen, Executive Director of Hays County Food Bank, stated they feel this is a strong location because of the Village and other health services next to them. She stated the land is close to the Interstate, and it was a donation which was a factor in their decision as well.
